## **Infrastructure Canada – Building Canada Plan**

Building Canada is focused on delivering results that matter to Canadians—cleaner air and water, safer roads, shorter commutes, and prosperous, livable communities. The goal of this seven-year plan, from 2007 to 2014, was to make a real difference in the everyday lives of Canadians, while supporting the nation's priorities—a stronger economy, cleaner environment and better communities. The Government of Canada and the Province of British Columbia signed the Canada-British Columbia Framework Agreement on November 6, 2007. Between 2007 and 2014, just over \$2.724 billion will be provided for infrastructure improvements in British Columbia under the Building Canada Plan.
